

THE VERB TO BE:

It is a main verb and an auxiliary verb. (Es el verbo más usado en inglés y es irregular)

SUBJECT + VERB + COMPLEMENT (OBJECT)

SUJETO + VERBO + COMPLEMENTO (OBJETO)
